Sign In/Out Procedure for Regular Meeting on Thursday



- Drop off time: **7:15 pm to 7:30 pm**
- Pick up the youth's ID card from the front desk when dropping off.
- Pick up time: **9:00 pm**
- Present the youth's ID card when picking up the youth.
- Parents will be given ONE additional ID card to use if a different parent/guardian picks up the youth.

Uniform

- Scout Cap, Grey Jersey, Neckerchief, Blue Pants, White Socks and Black Shoes
- Most of the items are ordered via PO form (Scout Canada and Group Supplier) except Blue Pants, White Socks and Black Shoes. **** No cuffed or leggings!**
- Crest and Badges: 6RH Group, Shining Water Council, Color Lair, Name Tag, Slide
- Progression Badge is given out after the Youth Progress Review in May. OAS and PAB Badge is given out when youth has successfully completed an assessment. Catholic Scout badge is optional
- **Mandatory** for all meetings.

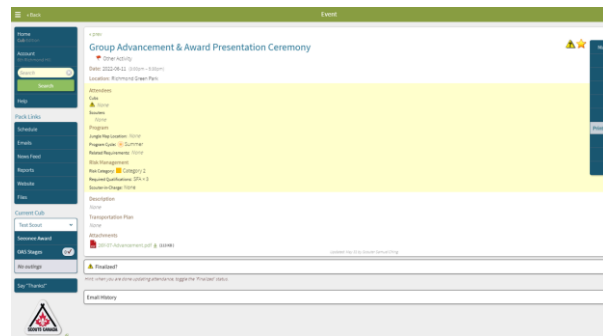
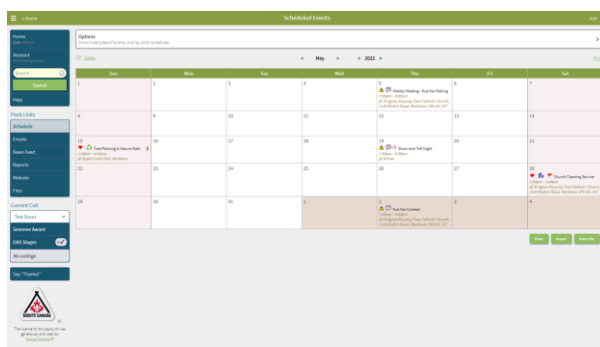
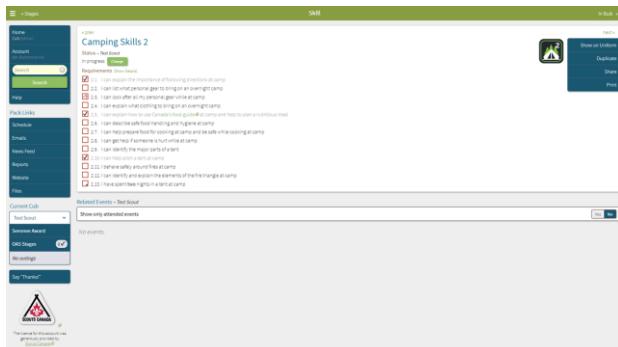
Scoutstracker

Communication



Weekly Email update from us: **Tuesday Night**



Email is the preferred communication tools between Scouters and parents.
Or, in person before or after meeting.



Lair Scouters will set up a WhatsApp Broadcast Group (within the next two weeks) for parents in the same lair. This is a one way communication for Scouters to broadcast messages.



Scouters will contact parents by phone in case of an emergency, or vice versa. (*Please DO NOT call the Scouters if it is not an emergency*).



WhatsApp will be used to communicate short notices between Scouters and parents.

Regular Meetings



Inform Scouters of any absences.



Arrive between 7:15 pm to 7:30 pm.
(There may not be enough Scouters before 7:15 pm). Late arrivers will not be allowed to join the opening ceremony.

DROP OFF



For safety reason, please accompany your child into and out of the school.
DO NOT let them come in by themselves.



Arrive in **FULL UNIFORM** (including group cap, grey jersey, name tag, scarf, navy blue pants, black shoes and white socks). Those with incomplete uniform **WILL NOT** be allowed to participate in the opening and closing ceremonies.



Please use the washroom before the meeting starts. **NO** washroom break during the meeting.

Read communication email from scouters on any special notice and events.



Arrange transportation to meetings and events, unless otherwise notified.



Arrive and pick up your child(ren) on time.



To protect the privacy of other youths, please **DO NOT** share pictures on social media before you get consent of everyone in the photo.

Register via Scoutstracker and make payment **BEFORE** the deadline.



Non-registered participants **WILL NOT** be accepted into the event.



Refunds **WILL NOT** be issued.

- As Scouters accumulate commendations, they will become eligible for Outstanding Service Awards and will be recognized with a medal and uniform insignia for each award.

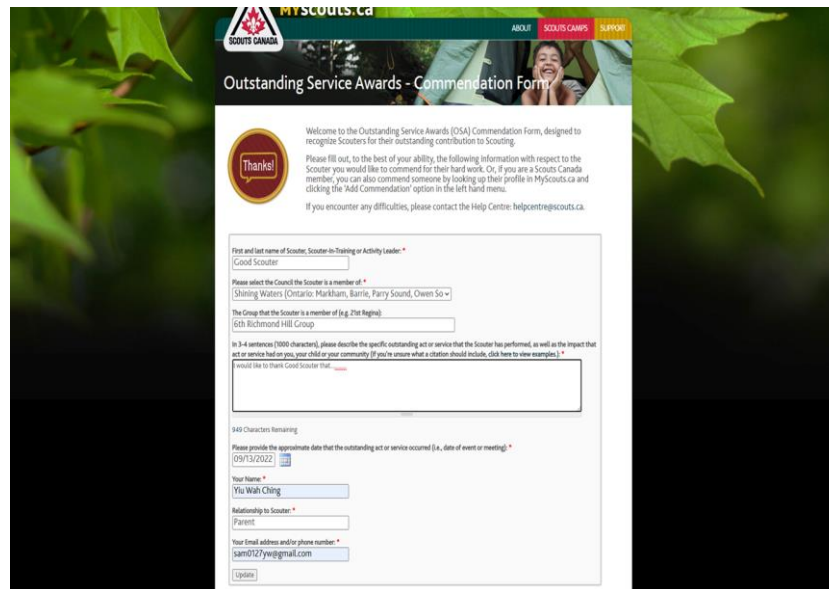
